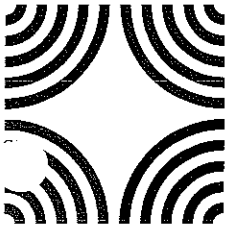
Upon receipt of this information, the SHPO will expeditiously review and comment upon the proposed projects.
