The meeting was called to order in the second floor classroom of the Middletown Police Station, 66 Church Street, at 8:40 P.M. by W. Howard, Chairman.

Prenatal Clinic

After discussion, and upon a motion by W. Mann, seconded by J. Nelson, the Council unanimously voted to recommend the inclusion of the prenatal program at \$4,500.00 in the second year application.

South Farms Improvements

After considerable discussion concerning the need for additional recreational facilities in the South Farms area, E. Dzialo moved, seconded by J. Nelson, to reaffirm the inclusion of the West Silver Street improvements in the budget and to allocate \$5,000.00 for an extensive feasibility study for a recreational facility in the South Farms area, to be developed in the third program year as a high priority item.

A. Kotlowitz moved to separate the road and recreational facility issues into two motions. The motion failed to carry a second.

The previous motion was approved, with A. Kotlowitz dissenting.

E. Dzialo suggested that a subcommittee be formed to assist in the recreational study.

Upon a motion by A. Kotlowitz, seconded by W. Mann, the Council unanimously voted to request the Mayor to appoint persons from the North End and South Farms areas to the Citizens Advisory Council.

W. Howard pointed out that a halfway house, such as requested by the Tri-County Alcohol Council, is an ineligible item for CD funding.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:30 P.M.
